40 Days Of Lent

Lent is 40 days long as a reminder of Jesus' 40 days in the wilderness and his defeat of temptation (Matthew 4). Here we are reminded that Jesus was also tempted and that he stood firm against Satan's temptations. This reminds us that he is our strength against all temptation in this life and our need for Christ's death on Good Friday. Jesus spent 40 days and nights in solitary contemplation of obedience to the will of God leading to Jesus fulfilling the purpose of God in the redeeming work of Jesus's own death on a Cross. During the quietness and stilling time of Lent, come to God both prayerfully and gracefully in contemplation of God's will for our lives in the decisions God leaves with each of us to make. The separation from God is spiritual death. In Jesus the atonement for our sin by his blood (Ephesians 1:7) enables renewed life to accept the clear vision which God has for us by the gift of grace if we will embrace the 40 days of Lent as our time to recognise the love of God specifically for us. In this time recognise the freedom from disobedience, guilt and separation from God. This is why we celebrate the season of Lent, to prepare us to receive God's reconciliation in Christ Jesus at Easter as we celebrate Jesus' glorious resurrection and the free gift of God's grace that brings us Forgiveness, Salvation, and Life Everlasting.
